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## FINAL ACTION: Referred

RESOLVED, that the YPS Governing Council craft and present to the assembly an IOP revision that would allow for candidates for YPS office to request and be provided with contact information for assembly members for the purpose of sending out one contact related to the election. This change shall include a mechanism for assembly members to opt out of campaign emails.

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Online forum testimony was mixed regarding this topic. The overall sentiment of the online forum comments was supportive of creating a mechanism for candidate outreach to YPS Assembly members. However, comments reflected differing opinions and raised questions regarding an appropriate process for candidate outreach. Additionally, concerns about codifying this process in the YPS Internal Operating Procedures (IOP) while maintaining compliance with the AMA election rules were expressed in the comments.

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As a point of clarification, your Reference Committee wishes to note that amendments to the YPS IOP will require adoption by the YPS Assembly, followed by Council on Constitution and Bylaws (CCB) review and Board of Trustees approval. These amendments should minimize conflict with AMA policies. Further, amendments involving a Bylaws change will need to be approved by the House of Delegates (HOD).

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Additionally, privacy and data use concerns will need to be considered in developing a process for candidate outreach.

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Giving the complexity of this issue, your Reference Committee believes it would be prudent to afford the Governing Council an opportunity to consult with the AMA legal team, CCB, and AMA staff to identify the best course of action. Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Resolution 1 be referred, with a report back at the 2024 Interim YPS Assembly meeting.
