 RECOMMENDED FOR ADOPTION AS AMENDED

REPORT B: UPDATE ON PROVIDING ASSEMBLY CONTACT INFORMATION TO CANDIDATES FOR YPS GOVERNING COUNCIL (RESOLUTION 1-A-24)

RECOMMENDATION A:

Report B be amended by addition and deletion:

That the AMA YPS safeguard its members' contact information and not provide personal information to AMA YPS candidates or AMA HOD candidates. That our GC survey other Sections for their best practices for candidates for Section leadership to engage AMA-YPS representatives and report back at A-25.

RECOMMENDATION B:

Report B be adopted as amended

Your YPS Governing Council recommends:

- 1. That the AMA-YPS safeguard its members' contact information and not provide personal information to AMA YPS candidates or AMA HOD candidates.
- 2. That the AMA-YPS adhere to applicable rules set forward in <u>AMA Election Rules</u> and <u>Guiding Principles G-610.090</u>

Online testimony was limited, with one comment in opposition to the report. Your Reference Committee understands that the candidates for Section leadership are interested in engaging with YPS representatives.

Your Reference Committee appreciates the Governing Council's efforts to adhere to HOD election policy. However, the provided recommendations do not accomplish the intended impact of the author with room for improvement in the language so a candidate running for election can have limited access to contact information, as is accomplished in other Sections.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Report B be adopted as amended.

(2) RESOLUTION 1: ADAPTING THE YPS IOPS FOR THE SPEAKERS' NEW ENDORSEMENT RULES

RECOMMENDATION A:

 The first Resolve in Resolution 1 be <u>amended by</u> addition and deletion:

RESOLVED, the YPS Governing Council shall appoint an endorsement committee composed of all the credentialed YPS members representatives at the 2025 Annual YPS Assembly meeting to determine during that meeting which eligible candidate will receive the YPS endorsement for YPS member of the AMA Board of Trustees.

RECOMMENDATION B:

The second Resolve in Resolution 1 be <u>deleted</u>:

RESOLVED, the YPS Governing Council shall immediately submit a revised endorsement process to the Speakers in place of the previous proposal, which stipulates that the YPS Governing Council shall appoint an endorsement committee composed of all the credentialed YPS members at the 2025 Annual YPS Assembly meeting to determine during that meeting which eligible candidate will receive the YPS endorsement for the YPS member of the AMA Board of Trustees.

RECOMMENDATION C:

Resolution 1 be adopted as amended

RESOLVED, that YPS Governing Council shall appoint an endorsement committee composed of all the credentialed YPS members at the 2025 Annual YPS Assembly meeting to determine during that meeting which eligible candidate will receive the YPS endorsement for YPS member of the AMA Board of Trustees, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the YPS Governing Council shall immediately submit a revised endorsement process to the Speakers in place of the previous proposal, which stipulates that the YPS Governing Council shall appoint an endorsement committee composed of all the credentialed YPS members at the 2025 Annual YPS Assembly meeting to determine during that meeting which eligible candidate will receive the YPS endorsement for the YPS member of the AMA Board of Trustees.

Online forum commentary from current Governing Council members provided clarification on these new endorsement rules from our Speakers'. The comment stated that Resolve 1 is in accordance with the endorsement rules but Resolve 2 may be deemed out of order.

Your Reference Committee concurs with the online forum commentary and believes that it captures the intent of the author. Resolve 1 was minorly amended, as representatives are credentialed in the YPS Assembly.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Resolution 1 be adopted as amended with a report back at A-25.

(3) RESOLUTION 2: PROMOTING MEDICATION CONTINUITY AND REDUCING PRIOR AUTHORIZATION BURDENS

RECOMMENDATION A:

The first Resolve in Resolution 2 be amended by addition and deletion:

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association advocate for state and federal legislation or regulations requiring health insurance companies to honor prior authorizations for medications for up to 12 months when patients switch between insurance plans or experience coverage gaps support federal and state legislation that minimizes the impact of prior authorization requirements for medications during transitions or lapses in insurance coverage; and be it further

RECOMMENDATION B:

Resolution 2 be adopted as amended.

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association advocate for state and federal legislation or regulations requiring health insurance companies to honor prior authorizations for medications for up to 12 months when patients switch between insurance plans or experience coverage gaps (Directive to Take Action); and be it further

RESOLVED, that our AMA collaborates with relevant stakeholders to develop and promote best practices for implementing medication continuity policies across different insurance plans and healthcare systems (Directive to Take Action)

Commentary was mixed for Resolution 2. The overall sentiment of the online forum comments was that patient medication coverage should not be impacted because of the negative impacts of prior authorization.

Your Reference Committee considered a delegation's amendment and believe that it still embodies the author's intent of the resolution. The language in the original Resolve 1 could be too specific and prescriptive and may influence the results of Resolve 2.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Resolution 2 be adopted as amended.

RECOMMENDED FOR FILING

(4) REPORT A: AMA ADVOCACY EFFORTS

RECOMMENDATION:

Report A be filed.

Report A includes key AMA advocacy priorities and AMA-YPS policy impact and influence. This is an informational report that provides an overview of advocacy efforts accomplished by the AMA. Further, this report details YPS policymaking successes that have contributed to the AMA's advocacy efforts and enhanced discussions on significant issues impacting patients and physicians

 (5) REPORT C: 2025 AND 2026 PROCESS FOR YPS ENDORSEMENTS OF CANDIDATES FOR HOD ELECTION

RECOMMENDATION:

Report C be <u>filed</u>.

Report C is an informational report outlining the 2025 and 2026 endorsement process for the HOD election. The Reference Committee appreciates the Governing Council's recommendation of adding additional language on how to release candidate information to the Assembly and any voting regulations but with limited testimony on the online forum, there is no drafted language.

Therefore, your Reference Committee recommends that Report C be filed.

RECOMMENDED FOR NOT ADOPTION

(6) RESOLUTION 3: COMPREHENSIVE THIRD-PARTY AUDIT OF AMA MEDICARE PAYMENT REFORM STRATEGY

RECOMMENDATION:

Resolution 3 be not adopted.

RESOLVED, that our American Medical Association will engage a third-party organization to conduct a comprehensive audit of the AMA's Medicare payment reform strategy; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this third-party audit will explore all aspects of the AMA's efforts regarding Medicare payment reform, including but not limited to: lobbying efforts, funding allocations, overall strategic approach, and any internal or external factors contributing to the lack of progress; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the findings of this third-party audit will be reported back to the HOD with actionable recommendations for how to improve and accelerate the AMA's Medicare payment reform efforts; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the AMA will commit to transparency by sharing the audit results and the steps taken in response with its membership and the public, demonstrating a renewed commitment to achieving meaningful Medicare payment reform.

Your Reference Committee appreciates the author's concerns on this issue. However, the Resolve clauses are not an appropriate process to go about this advocacy topic. Not only is there a large fiscal note attached to this resolution, but also transparency efforts are underway by the AMA.

Medicare Payment Reform is the top advocacy priority for the AMA. In 2023, the AMA launched the Fix Medicare Now campaign to press Congress for a stop to payment cuts and to enact bills that create a long-term solution to this issue. It should also be noted

1	that for several years, the AMA has been conducting focus groups and national polls
2	with patients and physicians to test Medicare messaging and to identify trends in
3	beneficiary access to care. Strategy is continuously reviewed and assessed by AMA
4	management with oversight from the Board of Trustees and in consultation with the
5	Council on Legislation, Federation partners, outside consultants, pollsters, and
6	Congressional champions.

8	In addition, BOT Report 10 at Interim 2024 provides a full update on the AMA's Medicare
9	payment reform efforts.
